PALZ is Bradford's Junior Youth Inclusion Programme

**An out of school activity programme for 8-13 year olds
aimed at preventing social exclusion**

PALZ aims to:

- **Reduce social exclusion**
- **Reduce the risk factors that indicate the likelihood of a young person offending**
- **Increase the protective factors that deter young people from offending including working with parents**
- **Reduce anti-social behaviour and nuisance in a neighbourhood**
- **Reduce non-school attendance among the identified young people**
- **Reduce youth offending rates among the identified young people.**



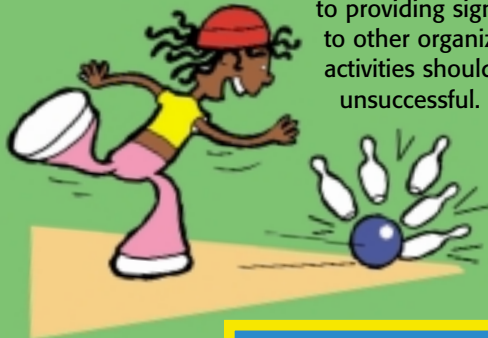
What do we offer?



PALZ will aim to engage the young people in a range of positive and socially inclusive activities for a minimum of 5 hours a week out-of-school time. PALZ will offer opportunities for a variety of play, educational and peer integration activities and community based projects. Regular feedback will be provided in addition to regular reviews to assess progress, with the aim of promoting sustainable community activities for children and young people attending PALZ.

Who are the target group?

Each PALZ project is required to engage the 25 (8-13 year olds) 'most at risk' of social exclusion, offending, and anti-social behaviour. We are committed to providing signposting routes to other organizations offering activities should a referral be unsuccessful.



Participation

Families will be consulted and involved in the design and delivery of the programme. PALZ ensure the views of children and parents/carers are respected and acted upon.

Success to date

The YIP model has a proven record in challenging the social and individual risk factors that makes a person more likely to be drawn into criminal or anti-social behaviour. PALZ will contribute to a more positive socialization process, which draws the young person, their family and the wider community together into a solution-focused programme.



Successful Senior YIPs have shown the YIP model to be a powerful force in the process of social cohesion.

Nominations

We take referrals from a wide range of statutory and voluntary agencies.

We will also take referrals from parents/carers and children and young people. To refer, contact the co-ordinators for a referral form.
